ALL GIFTS MUST BE TURNED INTO THE CHURCH OFFICE OR LEFT AT THE ANGEL TREE NO LATER THAN DECEMBER 21, 2021 BY NOON.

The Angel Tree gifts are for foster children and other needy children in San Luis Obispo County. The children's names are provided by social workers and eligibility staff from the San Luis Obispo County Department of Social Services. 


TUESDAY BIBLE STUDY

Did you know there is a wooden open Bible on a stand in the atrium garden on the right (South) side of the sanctuary? Do you know how we got that Bible?? If you go into the garden area you will see a small plaque that tells the story. It reads "In 1986 Lew Hammond asked Al Harvey if he would carve a replica of the Bible for the South Atrium of the Church.... After several weeks Al had it carved. It is displayed today as a beautiful addition to our church."

Lew Hammond was an active member of our church for many years as were Al and Madge Harvey. Al lived to be 102, and regularly attended church until his last few years. Madge was a talented artist, and several of us have her paintings.

These days, Joe Brown, who is also a woodworker, oils the wooden Bible regularly to maintain its beauty.


MEMORIAL SERVICE for WESTON ANDERSON


December 17th UMW Book Club Meeting Selection: <u>Shepherds Abiding</u>




Christmas Poinsettias
