The clergy on the Central Coast of the North District and lay representatives of our churches had a wonderful opportunity to share a simple meal with our Resident Bishop, Dottie Escobedo-Frank at a recent gathering held at the San Luis Obispo United Methodist Church. Gerry McGuire, Mary Hawkins, Joel Anderson, and I were in attendance. It was refreshing and encouraging to me as the Bishop spoke simply, kindly and in a straightforward manner to us all encouraging clergy to take their days off, their vacation time, continuing education time and a little more in the coming year! That theme will likely be extended as we gather soon for the 39<sup>th</sup> Session of the California-Pacific Annual Conference in Los Angeles at which the theme Ending Physical & Spiritual Hunger will focus on the word "Nourish!". The Bishop clearly understands how challenging recent years have been for all of us in the church!

In the preliminary report for the meeting, the Bishop wrote:

This year at Annual Conference we are focusing on "nourish." There are many ways we need to nourish our souls. The first is to rest, the second is to restore, and the third is to find joy.

Summer is a good time for all of us, laity and clergy alike, to focus on restoring the soul and establishing a pattern of rest, renewal and relaxation that can be built into one's lifestyle all year long. Read some poetry, spend time in nature, and involve yourself in something you love. Is it cooking, art, community concerts in the park? Whatever it is, break pace with your usual pattern and add something refreshing to the mix of activities that are yours this summer.

---Discoveries from a Secret World by Peter Wohlleben


Soul Reset by Junius B. Dotson





For the past several months the Trustees have been doing a "Spring Cleaning" and have been refreshing various areas of the church property. The following is a sample of some of the projects we have started or finished with many more being planned!

The church office was painted, and new cabinets added.

A new gardening company has been hired. They have installed new landscaping on the parking lot side of the church. New landscape plants are planned for the two sides of the driveway accessing the parking lot from Halcyon.

Two large windows in the sanctuary and the glass door leading to the children's Center that were damaged by vandals have been replaced.

The stained-glass windows from the Shell Beach Methodist Church were installed in the side transepts.

Other projects are planned. We currently have a workday every Wednesday from 9:00 - 11:00 a.m. and we are planning to have once a quarter Saturday workdays to involve more people.

At our last meeting the Trustees took a tour of the whole church campus, looking in all the various rooms and cupboards. In this way we hope to familiarize the whole committee with the facilities and begin to glean ideas of how we can improve our church facilities. They have already identified 50 orphaned, vulnerable children, most of them manage as best they can, housed with grandparents and relatives. The others orphaned children spend all their time on the streets, in need of food,

Construction of a home for orphaned children would provide these orphans a safe, nurturing environment, proper nutrition and, important, allow them to attend school.

Being in the first stages of development, with construction plans in hand, Enickson is seeking financial assistance to cover the construction costs.


