

TREASURER'S REPORT

We have a wonderful congregation. We exceeded our goal for the Easter offering, Christmas offering and Thanksgiving offering. Regular tithes and offerings are running above plan. Expenses are expected to continue above plan. Insurance and benefits costs continue well above the official inflation rate. Our Fiscal Year is not yet over, so please continue your generous giving

Looking at our expenses by category: 64% of our expenses goes to worship and ministry. This includes the pastor, Christian education and our wonderful music ministry. 14% goes towards maintaining our beautiful facility, utilities, insurance and repairs. 14% goes to support expenses, which includes the church office, administrative assistant, bookkeeper and their related expenses. 8% goes towards Apportionments. Apportionments support our Annual Conference as well as missions and programs of the United Methodist Church throughout the world including Africa University in Zimbabwe and United Methodist, historically Black colleges and universities, in the United States.

Looking at our expenses by expense type: 71% of our expenses go towards are paying our staff and their benefits, including our pastor, music staff and administrative assistant. We honored our hard-working staff this past month. Another 16% goes supporting our church facilities and operations, including utilities, maintenance, repairs, office supplies, postage etc. 8% goes towards our apportionments. 5% goes toward worship, music and Christian education supplies and equipment.



#### The Eternal Flame Sanctuary Lamp

Hanging from the ceiling on the left side of the sanctuary is the eternal flame sanctuary lamp. It was donated by Peggy Gallop in the 1980's in memory of her husband Robert. The sanctuary lamp is found in all Jewish synagogues and Catholic churches as well as many Methodist, Anglican, Lutheran and Eastern Orthodox churches. In Methodist churches it symbolizes the presence of Christ in the sanctuary. The tradition of the eternal flame dates back to the Old Testament when God told Moses that a lamp filled with the pure oil should perpetually burn in the Tabernacle (Ex 27:20-21).

# News from the Mission Team

#### What is Peace with Justice Sunday?

Peace with Justice Sunday is the first Sunday after Pentecost, May 26<sup>th</sup>. "Pentecost celebrates the outpouring of the Holy Spirit calling for God's shalom. Peace with Justice witnesses to God's demand for a faithful, just, disarmed, and secure world." (Par. 263.5, "The Book of Discipline 2008." This Special Sunday is a denomination-wide celebration intended to raise awareness that even in a world plagued by war and terror, violence and destruction, people of faith have a clear call to build peace with justice. As United Methodists, our yearning for peace must move us to act.

Did you know that our General Board of Church and Society holds a non-governmental, consultative status with the United Nations? This status allows us to participate in UN meetings, consultations and conferences. In so doing, we recognize and renew our call for social transformation, for the quest to open the doors of opportunity for all, to distribute resources more equitably, and to provide better care for persons in need.

The annual conference keeps 50 percent of donations for Peace with Justice ministries in the conference, providing educational resources, building and sustaining relationships, and helping mobilize networks to engage in social advocacy and action. Fifty percent of the donations collected fund national and international peacemaking



ministries and grants. We achieve peace with justice efforts by working with the World Council of Churches, interfaith and ecumenical bodies, and secular organizations for social -justice policies and programs that seek the wholeness of shalom for all of God's people. An online grant award process is available to all churches.

I believe that one of the wonderful aspects of The United Methodist Church is that we can do so much more together than we ever could do on our own. Your generosity provides funding to strengthen and foster just, equitable and durable solutions to the root causes of conflict. If you choose to give to this Special Sunday appeal, there will be a special envelope in your May 26<sup>th</sup> Sunday bulletin. Checks can be made out to FUMC-AG and write Peace with Justice on the memo line at the bottom. Bless you!

Small size towelette packs


Disposable razors with plastic handles




