### Ms. Anna and Mr. Paul's Preschool Class

Burr! Although the January weather was mostly sunny, we learned a lot about snow and animals that live in the Arctic Regions. We learned that all snowflakes have six sides, that they are made from ice crystals clinging to dust in clouds and that they melt in spring to create puddles and rivers. We also learned fun new songs like *Chubby Snowman*, *Peter Penguin*, and *I'm a Little Snowman*. The children enjoyed marshmallow math, perhaps because after adding and subtracting marshmallows they got to eat one! Last month I introduced pieces of *Zoo Phonics* and in February we will continue *Zoo Phonics* recognizing letter sounds and the letters in our name, tracing and writing letters in our names, and talking about what sounds the names of items around the classroom start with. Instead of Valentine's Day, we will hold a "Friendship Day" where Room 3 parents are invited to join our classroom for a Potluck Friendship Lunch (Date TBA). We will be discussing love, friendship and how to be a kind friend.
