From the Pastor

Thank you to the 32 people who participated in our Visioning Day Planning Meeting, to the additional 8-10 who met with the Rev. Rick Blunt on the Friday prior to our session and to all who gathered on Pentecost as he preached “*The Church of Your Dreams.*” We followed his lead as facilitator and named issues that matter most to Arroyo Grande First UMC. We will have Rev. Blunt’s report in hand soon. With this information and our best thinking/praying/decision-making in action, the Church Council will set new goals in keeping with our mission statement and begin to work on these goals in the coming months. Stay tuned for details of that work.

As we await Rick’s summary report, we are also waiting for every last estimate of giving card to be turned into the office so that we can name our budget for 2016-2017. Income will determine which goals we can realistically pursue. Income is a critical factor in our goal-setting. Staffing and program are shaped based upon the money available and many of our top-priority goals/interests require that the staff we already have in place remain in place, and in fact that some of these positions must have “more hours” available, not less. We pray that no budget cuts will be required and that money to do what we already do well will be there with enough wiggle room to expand and grow our ministry. Give in response to God’s grace, and please turn in your estimate of giving if you have not already done so.

I close with the words of the song the choir sang last Sunday. May this song sink into our souls and become a prayer for ALL OF US! It’s called “Grace Alone.”



Visiting with Joseph "Joe" Brown

Our conversation began with the discovery that we were born in the same year and only a couple months apart. It also happens to be quite a long time ago. We found right away that we had a lot in common to talk about. DEB



Joe is a native Californian, born in Long Beach. His father worked in the oil industry, and when Joe was in 2nd grade the family moved to his father's new job at Coalinga with Shell Oil Co. He finished high school in 1955, then went two years at Coalinga College and transferred to UCLA to earn a Chemistry degree in 1960. His employment started at the Shell Oil refinery in Dominguez and then on to the "Booming" technology industries with such aerospace companies as Pacific Semiconductors Inc., a subsidiary of TRW, Northrop Nortronics in Hawthorne, then finally to TRW (Thompson, Ramo, Woolridge) in 1963. He worked as an Industry Process Engineer in electronic soldering and assembly processes for 15 years. Many of his duties included working with subcontractors around the country solving electronic assembly problems. His next 15 years with TRW involved working on classified projects as a Product Assurance Manager. This included the disciplines of Product Quality Assurance, Reliability, Safety and Configuration Management on Special Access Programs that are important to our national security. Joe remarked that "it was fulfilling and fascinating to work in the technology where things were really happening". He retired in 1992.

Joe met Collene, his future wife, in Coalinga the year he graduated from high school. She and her family had rented an apartment next door for the summer. One day her family suddenly returned to their home in Yuma, AZ, and she was gone. He got her address and they exchanged letters every day; the "teenagers" were married in Yuma in 1957. Their son Jeff, who is single, graduated from Cal State Northridge and sells software programs used in medical offices. His home is in Northridge. Their daughter Cindy graduated from National University and is a Senior Sales Analyst for a snack food company. Her family consists of husband Doug and son Jake, and they live in Tustin. Doug is a master woodworker who built Joe's wood shop and many cabinets, their fireplace mantle and other beautiful features in Joe's home on the Mesa in rural Arroyo Grande.

Joe reflected on two very profound events that had significant effects on the family. During the 1994 Northridge earthquake, their son, who lived there in

Northridge, could not be reached for a couple of days. Jeff had many details to attend to and they were eventually relieved to learn of his successful survival. Shortly afterward in 1994 Joe's wife Collene developed the devastating autoimmune condition called Scleroderma that robs the victim of mobility and comfort, and can move into all the vital organs. Collene was eventually confined to a wheelchair and died after surviving for 16 years. They had been married for 53 years. Joe is grateful for the fact that he was retired and able to provide loving care for Collene during the time she needed him the most.

On many walls in his home can be found examples of Joe's unique hobby for the last 30 years, making wooden maps of the 50 states of the USA and the world. The individual pieces are made of different color shades or wood species for contrast. The outline of each cutout must be extremely accurate so that the pieces will interlock perfectly. The perfection is accomplished by precise outline tracing and a very accurate and an extremely stable reciprocating scroll saw. Joe's attentive accuracy is essential for the successful outcome of these beautiful displays. He enjoys making picture frames and other projects with wood, including a wishing well displayed in his back yard.

Joe is pleased that he and his sister Betty reunited after 32 years of separation. He spent 26 years away from church attendance, although he never lost devotion to Christ. He feels the positive effect of forgiveness he has received. He chose to join our church very soon after Collene died in March of 2010. His relationship with our church is his life's foundation.

Joe serves as Chairman of our church Communications Committee and has the reputation of conducting efficient and effective monthly meetings that are well focused on the mission to keep the congregation informed of the activities and programs of our church. He brought along his professional experience during his work years and shares his abilities very effectively.

It was a very rewarding experience for me to spend meaningful conversation time with Joe and to learn of his life and his many accomplishments.

May 2016—The Latest from the Trustees

Trustees approved a request from the Children's Center to construct an Art Patio for the children.

The Children's Center will raise the funds for the project and get the work done.

Trustees approved the purchase of a pole chain saw for miscellaneous tree trimming. It was acquired and tested on May 17th and it works great!

At our meeting we reviewed the current Church use policies and fee schedule. We will look to include a fee for a facilitator for events. This person will be a member of the



Church and will assist outside groups with access, acclimatization, clean up and lock up. Pastor Mary and Paul Holden will update the policies and fee schedule in time for the next board meeting.

We again agreed it is important that when requesting a new upcoming event that, after it is cleared on the Church calendar, the requestor complete the facility use request documents as well. All facility requests other than Church and Church committee events must receive Trustees' approval. Facilities can potentially be used free of charge to members for their functions but must first have Trustees' approval.

The Morning Exercise Group has been going on since 2000. It was started by Donna Schoeffler. Loretta Johnson and Mary Sorensen are our organizers with Wayne Huggins and Mary Thronson helping out as well. We welcome anyone who wants to do low maintenance exercising three times or less a week. We use DVDs. At 8:30 a.m. on Tuesday and Thursday we start with a *Leslie Samson* 1 mile movement tape. At 9:00 a.m. we use an old *Richard Simmons* DVD to continue our exercising. It lasts 45 minutes. We are done by

Then at 9:10 a.m. we use an *Improving your Balance* DVD. It is done mostly sitting in a chair. Each day costs \$1, which is paid when you come. The group is mostly Senior Citizens ranging from 60's to 90's. You come to move and visit. We celebrate birthdays and hold an annual Christmas Party. Anyone is welcome to just come and join us at 8:30 a.m. in Criswell Hall.

1. GENERAL CONFERENCE 2016: General Conference UMC 2016 was May 10-20 in Portland, Oregon. This is the only body of the church that can speak officially for the UMC. The delegates spent many hours with many issues with legislation for all over the world with a variety of issues. Each day began with worship with one of the bishops of the church bringing a message. You can watch much of the services and news on line umc.org/news-and-media/gc2016. Petitions which were acted on include: the creation of a new digital hymnal, Central conference issues, notable milestones, consecration of new Deaconess and Home Missioners, the commissioning of new missionaries from 11 countries which are being deployed to 16 countries around the world, adoption of the budget for the coming four years, celebrations for a variety of happenings.
