Ms. Andrea and Ms. Maddy's Preschool Class

Our school year's off to a great start and I'm so pleased to join Ms. Maddy and all your children in the Preschool Class! During the month of August, we had fun getting to know one other. We learned about our families, particularly how we're similar yet different and how each family and child brings a uniqueness to our classroom. We are also learning that mom and dad have actual names besides, "Mommy" and "Daddy". We are discussing shapes, with an emphasis on squares and how it has four equal sides. We are learning colors, with a focus on yellow, and counting from 1-10, using a number of different objects. The magnetic marbles and beads have been the favorite items to count. We are learning how to walk in class, raise a quiet hand during group, and how to speak to others, when having a problem, so we can move towards to a solution. Lastly, we have enjoyed a number of fascinating stories about objects from home during share time. We welcome everyone to bring an item from home to share, as long as it fits in our basket and is durable enough to pass around the room. Reminder: If you are running late, your child does not get counted for snack and might miss out. Also, some children don't care for our snack, so please pack an extra something, just in case. We are looking forward to another great month.

In August we learned about ourselves, focusing on differences and similarities in hair, eye, and skin color. Children enjoyed looking in the mirror and talking about themselves. They also had fun using stamp pads, of different colors, to make their hand and foot prints. Many of the children have been practicing riding the trikes around the courtyard, learning to use the peddles and to go the direction of the arrows. Many have also been enjoying digging in the sandbox and engaging in water play. Several children are enjoying cooking pretend foods and having "picnics" in our dramatic play area. Our group has been very helpful taking care of our vegetable and flower gardens, by watering the plants when needed. They

have enjoyed picking and eating the red ripe strawberries, too. They are learning to wait patiently for the strawberries to turn red, observing the change in colors as they wait a few days longer. Our group has also been learning about farm animals and have been having fun practicing the different sounds that they make. We have been talking about some of the things that we do with our families and are enjoying learning about shapes and colors. The children are still getting used to the routines and their new classroom environment. It is a big step for some of the children and it takes time to adjust. In September, we will be learning about different kinds of apples. We will be counting, sorting and tasting them. Thank you to my two Young Toddler moms, who were able to attend our "Back To School Night". I really enjoyed that time with you! I really want to support all of my Young Toddler Families in whatever way I can. I would love to share a couple resources, that may be helpful to you, as parents and family members of young toddlers. "1,2,3, The Toddler Years" by Irene Van der Zande and "No Bad Kids" by Janet Lansbury, are both great books, that I would be happy to loan out. In September, we will continue to focus on getting to know each other better, helping each child develop their sense of belonging and significance as part of our group. I will continue to focus on providing predictability in your child's day and helping them to develop a sense of security, by establishing consistent and familiar routines and boundaries. Many of the children are already feeling safe and secure enough to test those boundaries. If you notice this at home too, know that this is a good and healthy thing. Just remember that consistency and follow-through are very important! This month, I will provide opportunities for the children to explore their similarities and differences, as they are showing more and more interest in each other. I will also introduce concepts associated with the exploration of apples. I will soon be sending home a little white "Apple Bag" for your child to bring an apple back to school in, for us to explore. We will explore their similarities and differences, discover the star in the middle, enjoy tasting them and make applesauce together.
