In 2016 our Stewardship Campaign theme was "ALL OF US". The next year rolled around quickly. Our church does not yet have a designated "Stewardship Team" and the responsibility for the annual stewardship drive was taken on by the Finance Committee. This is unusual for most churches We need to develop a team that lifts up all kinds of stewardship all year long---time, talent, service and all the rest. Nevertheless, Joel and I had to come up with something to highlight our spring effort to encourage givers to give. So, in 2016 the theme became HOPE RISING! We liked it. In some back and forth via e-mail we chose symbols---hands, a sprout, the covenant rainbow from Genesis, a symbol of hope and the fulfillment of God's promise to the people. 

"Happiness & Joy"

Have you noticed how many articles, books, write-ups and sayings there are about Happiness and Joy? One of our UMW circles read *The Book of JOY* by the Dalai Lama and Archbishop Desmond Tutu. The UMW book club also read it. The best selling book *The Life-changing Magic of Tidying Up* recommends keeping only those things that "give you joy". While I was waiting for my prescriptions to be filled yesterday, I checked out the magazines – one was titled "*The Happiness Formula – How to find Joy and Live Your Best Life - New Scientific Discoveries*". (Of course, I couldn't resist buying it!) And the city of San Luis Obispo held the title of "Happiest Town" for a while.

What is all this fascination with "Happiness & Joy"? From the magazine – "The Happiness Formula", a quote: "Happiness: It's the thing most of us feel we should have more of." Their research says... "happy people tend to live longer, exhibit fewer or less severe mental health issues, have more friends and perform better at work." Kristin Layous, Ph.D.

In her studies, Layous compared the effects of trying to make someone else happier to the effects of trying to make oneself happier. She found subjects who exerted more effort trying to brighten others' days felt happier than those who tried to brighten their own. She went on to state that "there's more and more evidence accumulating that focusing on others makes us much happier than focusing on ourselves."

In *The Book of Joy*, Archbishop Tutu states, "I mean simply to say that ultimately our greatest joy is when we seek to do good for others. We are wired to be caring for the other and generous to one another. We shrivel when we are not able to interact." But the archbishop reminds us that the goal is not just to create joy for ourselves but, "to be a reservoir of joy, an oasis of peace, a pool of serenity that can ripple out to all those around you."

For many of us the *Bible* is the first book to which we look to on how to find JOY. Although it does not use the word "joy" specifically we are directed to take care of others first. In Matthew 7:12 Jesus says "In everything do to others as you would have them do to you; for this is the law and the prophets." And in Philippians 2:3-5 we find "Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. Let each of you look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others."

Maybe we can all find a bit more joy and happiness as we proceed through life by reaching out to others each day. Give it a try!
