

"A Beautiful Day in the Neighborhood" is the recently released movie starring Tom Hanks that tells the story of "Mister Rogers". It is currently showing in San Luis Obispo. Do you know who Mister Rogers was? Did you watch it as a child or did your children? Mine did! And I watched along with them many days! He was a very lovable character who fascinated my sons. Watching Mister Rogers was a part of our daily activity or routine.

Did you know that Fred Rogers was an ordained Presbyterian minister? He studied and received his degree from Pittsburgh Theological Seminary. He was ordained to "minister to children and families through television". Long fascinated by puppets, he created Mister Rogers' Neighborhood in 1966.

In a commencement address at Dartmouth College in 2002 Rogers said, "I'd like to be remembered for being a compassionate human being who happened to be fortunate enough to be born at a time when there was a fabulous thing called television that could allow me to use all the talents that had been given me."

He encouraged the children, his viewers, "to live your best, kindest life". He fiercely believed that all people deserved love. His conviction wasn't simply sentimental; it came directly from his Christian faith. God, he insisted, loves us just the way we are. "I like you as you are, exactly and precisely! I think you turned out nicely and I like you as you are."

He approached his young audience with respect and directness about issues children face that were rarely touched on by other programs. Dressed in his cardigan and sneakers, Fred Rogers offered a wholesome message of generosity and love. He invited guests on his show that portrayed all sorts of conditions and from all walks of life. He took a stand against racial inequality when he invited a black character to join him in a swimming pool at a time when most city pools were closed to blacks.

In 1983 he said, "I want to be a vehicle for God, to spread his message of love and peace."

What a wonderful attitude to copy as we approach Christmas time. See you at the movies!
