From the editor: The January 3rd message to her students from Carolyn Russell, our Sunday School Teacher, tells of Jesus' words in Matthew 6:25-34 about the problem of worry.

This is a message for all of us.

Hello,

Sometimes we worry. Life is full of reasons to worry. There may be people in your life who are ill. There may not be much money. You may have trouble understanding something in school. This list can go on and on.

Jesus' words in today's Bible passage speak to the problem of worry. The passage is found in Matthew 6:25-34. The crowd of people were gathered to listen to Jesus. Jesus talked about the riches here on earth, and that they would not last forever. Jesus talked about the riches that all would find in heaven. Jesus pointed out that the birds were always provided for. They always had food. Who takes care of them? God. Do birds worry? No. God takes care of them. God also takes care of us. We must rely on God in our times of need and know that God will help us.



What do these words mean for your own life? You might worry about things in your own family. When your worries become great, sometimes you need to think of all the big people in your life who are looking out for you. ELT SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE FOR FALL, 2021

Everett Lee Taylor Scholarship applications are available on-line (www.worshipweekly.com) and in the church office beginning in March. The purpose of this scholarship is to help deserving United Methodist students enrolled in accredited universities, college, and technical schools defray the cost of their education.



Only students who are or have been active participants in the Arroyo Grande First United Methodist Church may apply. Graduating high school seniors must include letters of recommendation as well as a high school transcript with their completed applications. Returning college students will need to provide a college transcript but are not required to submit letters of recommendation. Students may apply for this scholarship more than once as long as they have maintained a minimum 2.5 GPA in their college work.

The completed application with required attachments must be turned in to the church office by May 15th. Everett Lee Taylor Scholarship recipients will be announced in early June. Scholarship checks will be given to recipients upon proof of registration in Fall, 2021 college classes.

So, if you would like to be considered for an ELT Scholarship, please submit a completed application by May 15th.

"A Life That Really Matters"

As I mentioned last month, I have been cleaning bookshelves and discovering many "treasures" that I didn't know were still around! I have just discovered a book entitled, "A Life That Really Matters" by Methodist Pastor Danny E. Morris. It was written, I believe, in 1968! That seems to be a very long time ago! It is still quite relevant today. It is the story of a new Methodist church, the John Wesley United Methodist Church in Tallahassee, Florida. Danny Morris was their founding pastor. They began in 1960 with a charter membership of 144. When the book was written the membership had grown to 440!

In 1965 Sam Teague, the teacher of the Young Adult Sunday School class, was struggling with how to challenge the young adults so that they could "have a life that really matters." With inspiration from God, he began writing a program, which he titled, "The Ten Brave Christians". The program, which he sometimes called "The Great Experiment", was patterned after John Wesley's early Methodist Societies. Morris relates that "225 years ago John Wesley discovered the genius of small groups meeting together regularly to pray, to study the Scriptures, and to witness. John Wesley found that a spiritual discipline helped prepare people to experience God's presence."

The program developed by Teague and a colleague was titled, "The John Wesley Great Experiment!". Teague wrote - Wanted: Ten Brave Christians who for one month

Will meet once each week to pray together

Will give two hours time each week to our church (self-surrender).

Will give God 1/10 of earnings during this month (self sacrifice).


Will spend 5:30 – 6:00 each morning in prayer and meditation (self-control)

Will witness for God their experience to others.

He presented the program to his class and waited for a response. For most it took a lot of thinking and pondering before decisions were made. "They began to think seriously about this concept that perhaps the purpose of life is not

necessarily to be happy, but to build a life that matters. They began to ask the question, "How do I build such a life?" Needless to say the Great Experiment was a success. As time went on, more and more joined in the program. The church grew and has done much good in the community and the lives of many were changed.

I wonder how this program would work in today's world. Would we be able to perform these disciplines? What would happen to our church and our world if we tried such a program?

MISSION HIGHLIGHTS:

GOD'S STEADFAST LOVE...IN ACTION

As we begin our Lenten journey, there are some people who give up something that is a "favorite" and a challenge to give up. I choose to add a discipline that is a challenge in a different way.

This year, I am challenging myself and others to help out with a new ministry in Haiti. Remember when we helped buy a pump for a new well for a community in need of safe water? The church and community were appreciative of our support.

A dream of Enickson, who is the pastor of that same small church, is hoping to begin a Sewing Ministry for students who have no funds to be able to further their education at a college or university. The idea is to provide a Sewing Ministry to teach students a skill that can be a marketing tool for them in order to support themselves as they go forward in life. He is hoping for these students to find success.

They have a goal to begin with 15 students as the funds are raised to start the program. To raise the funds for each student, it will take \$238.

A class of 15 students would be a total of \$3,570. This is certainly cheaper than it would be to help 15 students to gain a skill here in Arroyo Grande.

Costs: Sewing Machine 150.00, Table 50.00,

Scissors 5.00, Metric Ruler 12.00, Material 15.00, and Thread 6.00.


If you are interested in participating in this challenge let me know and we can help make that happen. Checks can be ent to the Church marked Sewing Ministry.


WOULD YOU LIKE TO ORDER FLOWERS FOR VIDEO WORSHIP?
