## **Report on the General Conference**



The recent General Conference of the United Methodist Church has received a lot of publicity. There is an abundance of material, both in written and video form reporting the specifics of legislation and giving you direct experience of the proceedings of the General Conference. We name major themes in broad strokes here and encourage those interested to go directly to the Cal-Pac website to view worship services, preaching, legislative outcomes and celebrations. Some of the major work and decisions made include:

Regionalization of the church. Thus, the Methodist churches in Africa or Asia are not bound by what is decided in the United States. Each region can make decisions based on what best fits with its own traditions and cultures.

Revisions in the Book of Discipline to remove discriminatory language.

Revision of The Social Principles at the heart of our mission to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. The Social Principles are not church law but form a set of guidelines we use to shape ministries of outreach to the world.

Deacons were given sacramental rights. This means Deacons can now offer Holy Communion and conduct baptisms where they have been appointed to serve.

The Conference did some serious budget cutting because of a significant drop in income due in part to churches disaffiliating from the United Methodist Church. The number of bishops was reduced.

These are top level decisions which have a minimal direct effect on our ministry at the First United Methodist Church of Arroyo Grande. We have a loving, generous, accepting congregation where Hope Joy and Love are rising and continue to value inclusiveness as we strive to create a spiritual home for all.





## From the Pastor:

The Book of Discipline is published every four years and sets forth the plan by which we United Methodists govern ourselves. It reflects our understanding of the Church and of what is expected of its laity and clergy as we seek to be effective witnesses in the world as part of the whole body of Christ.

I am aware in talking to folks that some of our newer members and/or members who have joined from other denominations are not familiar with the Book of Discipline, much less the rules of the church with regard to retirement. In order to prevent anyone from being taken by surprise July 1, 2025, let me fill you in on what the Book of Discipline has to say.

Normal retirement begins at age 65 or with 40 years of service.

Early retirement is available at age 62 or with 30 years of service.

Mandatory retirement is age 72.

Under the 20-year rule, a pastor can retire after 20 years of service but cannot receive retirement benefits until 62.

I was ordained a Deacon in 1983, an Elder in 1986, and will retire in 2025 with 41 years serving local churches as clergy. With two years as a non-ordained person in campus ministry, and four years as a non-ordained church staff member, that's 47 years of service!

According to The Book of Discipline every clergy member of the annual conference who will have attained age seventy-two on or before July 1 will be retired at Annual Conference of that year. Therefore, we have thirteen months to enjoy working together and to strengthen and ready our church for the transition to come. Let's worship, plan, party and have fun doing it!

Hope this brings some clarity to all. The Staff Parish Relations Committee and I can explain the appointment process in a future Castanet. We want you to be "in the know."

# News from the Mission Team

## Mission Team visits the 5 Cities Homeless Coalition (5CHC)

We all know there are homeless individuals living in San Luis Obispo County - in fact this year's Point-In-Time Count just released records to show that 1171 people are experiencing homelessness throughout San Luis Obispo County. The good news is that there has been an increase of "sheltered" homeless, individuals who have a roof over their heads through a congregate or non-congregate shelter. Seven members of our Mission Team, spouses and guests recently toured the 5 Cities Homeless Coalition Cabins for Change, located at 16th and Longbranch in Grover Beach. Janna Nichols, the Executive Director, led the tour.

The 5CHC began in 2009 as an all-volunteer organization. By 2012 they had paid staff. For the first 10 years, their focus was all about housing. During Covid, they found 10 spots at a campground in the Coastal Dunes RV Park for homeless. They were able to house 8 clients in the first 2 months! That was an "Ah ha" moment for the organization! So, they began to focus on providing housing and found shelters, like were used in Hurricane Katrina's model plan, which are now used up and down the coast. Those cabins cost about \$15,000 each. With support from the Board of Supervisors, the County, Grover Beach City Council, Congressman Carbajal, and many grants, their 20 Cabins for change opened December 2022. Since that time, there have been 85 participants and 70 are now in permanent housing, with 20 currently in cabins!

When the clients first come in, she said they are anxious and just want to sleep and feel secure. They receive a free cell phone and a case management worker, who determines how they became homeless and whether they want to have a

home. The client needs to come up with a plan to get out of homelessness, otherwise they have to leave after 90 days if they are not trying. Clients who are committed can stay and they receive lots of support, but have to transition out within 6-9 months. They have a 90% retention rate once their clients are in a home of their own!

Over the years, they have had to grow staff in order to handle all their programs, which now totals 43 employees! Clients at the Cabins for Change receive a continental breakfast and full hot dinner from a restaurant in the social hall. Lunch is on their own and many use the People's Kitchen which is nearby. The program is very successful but costly and needs financial support!

We were lucky enough to also be able to tour their newest site off 4th St. on Barca. It is a similar site with 30 cabins, donated by the Balay Ko Foundation, a Filipino organization in southern California. In addition, Finns Restaurant has donated 1/2 million dollars so far and hosted a large fundraiser recently in May. 


