


JANUARY 2025 UWF BOOK CLUB SELECTION: The Book That Matters Most by Ann Hood

Happy New Year!

What a joy to serve this congregation for the past nine and half years! We have accomplished good things together. We have six months to share between now and my mandatory retirement on June 30, 2025. It's time to enjoy ongoing activities and prepare to receive new leadership.

My retirement raises questions about the **process of appointing the next pastor** for the First United Methodist Church of Arroyo Grande (FUMCAG). That process will unfold over a period of months between now and the end of June. Your leaders and I have begun the process of preparing for a smooth transition. Below you will find a summary of steps which will happen.

- NOW please begin praying for the process of choosing FUMCAG's next pastor. Pray for our Staff Parish Relations Committee (SPRC) as they will be working with the Bishop and District Superintendents to select my successor.
- IN PROCESS the SPRC will communicate a thorough and thoughtful description of FUMCAG, and its vision for the years ahead. They will speak on behalf of the congregation in clarifying what is needed and desired in the next pastor.
- YOU CAN HAVE INFORMAL CONVERSATIONS WITH YOUR SPRC MEMBERS and let them know what you think the most important needs of the church are with regard to pastoral leadership. What gifts, graces and skills are needed to grow the church forward as the congregation moves ahead?
- <u>EARLY JANUARY</u> The **Bishop will publish a list of all "clear openings".** Clergy are welcomed to send suggestions of people they believe may be a good fit. A pastor may put their own name forward for consideration. The Cabinet will consider such information in their discernment process.
- <u>EARLY to MID-JANUARY</u> The bishop and the superintendents in California-Pacific Annual Conference will meet and spend time in prayer and conversation about which pastors to appoint to which congregations.
- Your job is to focus prayer for the bishop and district superintendents as they are in the process of discerning whom God would have become FUMCAG's pastor.
- LATE JANUARY to EARLY MAY The District Superintendent will introduce the pastor designee to our SPRC in a confidential meeting to confirm a good fit. As the currently appointed pastor, I am not directly involved in that meeting.
- SOON AFTER THE MEETING WITH THE SPRC An announcement of the new pastor will be made to our congregation and a simultaneous announcement will be made at the current church of the incoming pastor. The announcement has to remain confidential until it is announced to both congregations.

- <u>FOLLOWING THE ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE NEW PASTOR</u> there may be several months remaining prior to Annual Conference or a very short time depending on when the appointment is made.
- JUNE 2025 My last Sunday leading worship at FUMCAG will be around annual Conference time which is June 11-14th.
- <u>JULY 2025</u>— **The new pastor begins July 1, 2025**. Typically, an incoming pastor is allowed several weeks to unpack, rest, and get acclimated to the church and community, and **starts preaching mid-July**. So, there may be a couple weeks of pulpit guests.

What about the next six months? We have a lot yet to accomplish and to celebrate.

- We are strengthening committees and launching new leaders.
- We are **revisiting church goals** and picking up pieces that fell away during the pandemic.
- We will plan **welcome celebrations** to connect the congregation with new leadership.
- We will create a new pictorial directory to include new pastoral leadership and staff.

This is **NOT** a time to hit **PAUSE**. I will not slow down and slide into retirement. Join me in making this an active, energetic time of planning and preparing together. We have everything we need to flourish: a superb and dedicated staff, solid lay leadership, and a well-cared for fully paid building.

Transitions can be fun and full of new possibilities. This promises to be a good thing for both FUMCAG and for me. I am excited to see what God has in store for you and for me, and I am confident that the next chapter in FUMCAG's life will be better than we can yet imagine. Let's make the most of the next six months!

Connie Clark and her trusty steed Miss Cee regularly patrol the beaches of Oceano Dunes State Vehicular Recreation Area and Pismo State Beach. The horse and rider are volunteer members of the Oceano Mounted Patrol which works closely with state park rangers. The mounted patrol provides the rangers with extra eyes to monitor park activities, can access back areas of the dunes that cannot be easily reached by other means, and are goodwill ambassadors. Almost everyone loves seeing the volunteer rangers on horseback, and many come up to talk or pet the The horses have to go through a thorough horse. certification process, be good with children and dogs, and don't mind going into the ocean. Connie has been active with the Oceano Mounted Patrol for many years. Volunteers on horseback have patrolled Oceano's beaches since at least World War II, when they watched for enemy

spies and submarines. Nowadays they watch for things like illegal campfires, loose dogs and people needing help. Next time you visit the beach you can watch for Connie and Miss Cee.

"DO YOU RECOGNIZE THIS PURCHASE" SCAM

Scammers send out an e-mail that looks like it comes from your credit card company asking if a certain large purchase was authorized, and to click or call if it was not authorized. Of course you don't recognize it, the scammer made it up and wants you to click or call so they can defraud you. The e-mail looks legitimate because the scammers copy the card company's legitimate e-mail. Some clues that it is a scam: The legitimate e-mail will reference the last 4 digits of your card number. The scam e-mail does not. The card company's name should appear on the left of the @ sign in the senders e-mail address. The scammers may include the card company name on the right of the @ sign, but usually not to the left. Rather than click on the link and fall for their scam, check your account on the card company's web site. If you don't see the charge then you know it is a scam and can delete the e-mail. If you do see an unauthorized charge, call the number on the back of your card to report it.

This is our team which served People's Kitchen on Dec. 31st, 2024: Frank Williams, Debbie Bradley, Evelyn Bradley, Dorine Bolterman, Hilary Henderson and Patty Williams.

We are sad to inform you that Priscilla Alquist resigned as Mission Chairperson. She will be missed.

We met on December 11, 2024, to discuss our agenda. We made casseroles for People's Kitchen December 30th and served approximately 60 people on December 31st.

Our Mission Team donated \$1,000 to each of the following organizations: 5 Cities Christian Women's Food Pantry, the People's Kitchen and the 5 Cities Homeless Coalition (5CHC). We are working on putting together information for the homeless so they will know which organizations are available and when. 5CHC has a warming center at 1023 East Grand Ave., Arroyo Grande, CA 93420. They pickup at certain locations in the late afternoon and take people back the next morning. Information is on their website.

Human Relations Day on January 19 is one of six churchwide Special Sunday offerings of The United Methodist Church. Human Relations Day calls United Methodists to recognize the right of all God's children in realizing their potential as human beings in relationship with one another. The special offering benefits neighborhood ministries through community Developers, community advocacy through United Methodist Voluntary Services and work with at-risk teens through the Youth Offender Rehabilitation Program.

Human Relations Day reminds us of Dr. King's vision of the beloved community that speaks of loving every neighbor as ourselves. It calls us into "neighborhood," with all kinds of people in all kinds of places. We give thanks for those already working to bring the vision to reality and join together to continue this work of God's kingdom more fully.
